Costs and funding opportunities are highly variable depending on state and choice of workflow. Staffing levels and engagement can vary, from minimal guidance to lead patients to established Overdose Education and Naloxone Distribution programs, to part-time/full-time positions to organize and execute new programs. There are multiple funding opportunities to become a program.
